"Villa Kvithøvd" in Bestum, in the vicinity of Christiania, where Wanda Maria Hjort (født Gräfin von der Marwitz) moved with her four kids after the separation from Johan Hjort



I begin with the Hjort-family that I derive from: the marriage of Wanda Maria von der Marwitz and Johan Hjort (the sea biologist) and the four children Johan Bernhard (Falle), Astrid, Wanda Maria, and Erling. Both Astrid and Wanda (daughter) married in 1919 the two brothers Graf von der Goltz (which I interpret as an arrangement made by the unhappy divorced mother who did everything for bringing back her daughters into the old Prussian nobility which she considered as the world where they belonged).



The first picture is taken in park of the castle in Friedersdorf where the mother was born and raised and where she went with her children (without their father) possibly every year. From left to right: Astrid, Wanda (mother), Erling, and Johan Bernhard.
